

“NO MORE ROOM!”

Luke 2:7 – “And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn.”



As we enter into the Christmas season, let us not forget to make room for Christ. There really is no Christmas without Christ! God promised to send a seed, The Messiah, who would bless the nations. Let me briefly tell you about the seed in the “Old Testament”; the same seed who laid in a manger after he was born because there was no room for Him in the inn. Some things to ponder in your heart: (1) The physical line through whom the Messiah was to come included Gentiles. The blessings of the Abrahamic covenant extended to the Gentiles. (2) The coming “seed” was spoken of as a prophet, a priest, and a king. Moses told the nation of Israel that God would raise up a prophet like him ([Deuteronomy 18:17-19](#)). (3) The coming “seed” was described as both human and divine. The promised seed had to be both God and man. (4) The coming “seed” was to be a triumphant king and yet also a suffering servant. Jesus was to be both a “lion” of the tribe of Judah (see [Genesis 49:9](#); [Revelation 5:5](#)) and the “lamb” who takes away the sins of the world (see [Isaiah 53:5-7](#); [John 1:29](#); [Revelation 5:6, 8, 12](#)). (5) The promised “seed” was described as gentle and yet also fierce. The Messiah was to be harmless and humble:

It seems so sad that a King such as this would not have a royal suite awaiting his arrival adorned with all the accessories fit for a little Prince; instead because there was no room for Him he laid in the rubbish in a cold barnyard where he was kept warm by the breath of the animals who were there with him. He exchanged his royal diadem for a crown of thorns to descend to earth on behalf of a people who didn’t even know who he was. He came as the Redeeming Savior but quickly became the Suffering Servant! His regal robe which enclosed his immortal body was replaced by mere swaddling clothes to cover his nakedness because there was no room for Him. As promised, He travelled through 42 generations to reach a dying world, yet walked the shores of Galilee for three-and-a-half years to redeem a dying world; some who had no room for Him.

Without Christ in Christmas, all you have left is “mas”. In Spanish, that means “more.” If there is no Christ (Spirit), then you are left with Self (Flesh). So, no Christ in your life means more Sexual Immorality; no Christ in your life means more Impurity, no Christ in your life means more Debauchery, no Christ in your life means more Discord, no Christ in your life means more Idolatry, no Christ in your life means more Witchcraft, no Christ in your life means more Hatred, no Christ in your life means more Jealousy, no Christ in your life means more Fits of Rage, no Christ in your life means more Wrath, no Christ in your life means more Strife, no Christ in your life means more Selfish Ambitions, no Christ in your life means more Dissension, no Christ in your life means more Envyings, no Christ in your life means more Murders, no Christ in your life means more Drunkenness, and no Christ in your life means more Envy. They which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God ([Galatians 5:19-21](#)). But when you make room for Christ in your life, you will have an abundance of Love, Joy, Peace, Longsuffering, Gentleness, Goodness, Faith, Meekness, and Temperance.

Why would you not make room to receive the greatest gift of all time that will last you an eternity? Why would you not make room for Christ who came that you might have life and have it more abundantly? Why would you not make room if you’re tired of living beneath your destiny? Why would you not make room if you’re ready to move from where you are to where God wants you to be? Why would you not make room if you desire a closer and more intimate relationship with Christ? Why would you not make room if you want blessings that you don’t have room enough to receive? Why would you not make room if you simply want more “mas” out of life? If you’re serious about the Gift and you’ve made up your mind I invite you to let Christ become the Lord of your life. Ask him to forgive you of your sins. Believe in your heart that He is the Son of God and that God raised Him from the dead. You can be saved just like that!
